

Table-1 shows that more than half (52%) of the respondent between 36 to 40yrs of age group, 22% were 31 to 35yrs, 14% were below 30yrs 12% were above 40yrs. Majority (64%) of the respondents married and remaining 36% were unmarried. Majority (66%) of the respondents between upto HSC qualification, 20% were graduate 14% were illiterate. More than half (56%) of the respondent below 5yrs of experience, 26% were 6 to 10yrs, 18% were above 10yrs. 50% of the respondents have body pain, 38% stomach problems and 12% were suffered nerves problem.
