LIBRARY AUTOMATION STATUS IN HKES (HYDERABAD KARNATAKA EDUCATION SOCIETY) INSTITUTIONAL LIBRARIES IN GULBARGA CITY: A SURVEY

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ABSTRACT

An attempt has been made in this study to find out the status of library automation in Hyderabad Karnataka Education Society (HKES) Institutional libraries, The findings presented are based on a survey conducted with the help of questionnaire, the survey includes applications of computers in housekeeping operations, the paper concluded that technological level of the institutional libraries is far below the satisfactory level. No institutional libraries provide computerized access to in house database among 14. E-mail and internet facility is available in many libraries, the result of this survey confirm that print culture is still dominating in HKE'S institutional libraries of this region.

Library automation is the part of IT applications which includes collecting, storing, manipulating, processing and communicating information, librarians connotations of IT should also include all those technologies which are used for collection, processing, storage, retrieval and dissemination of recorded information, library networking, reprography technical communication and library administration and management environment"¹

5. FINDINGS

Major findings of this study are

- 1. Maximum number of libraries was established during 1958-65 and 1976-80.
- 2. Only seven of libraries have professional staff.
- 3. Only four libraries have CD-ROM collection.
- 4. Charging and discharging of books, Reference service, and New paper Clipping Service, are offered by all the libraries.
- 5. Among eleven libraries, nine libraries are using computer (s).
- 6. Printer, scanner and Fax machine are the other equipment available in these libraries.
- 7. Major findings of the study are Telephone lines are used mainly to access Internet.
- 8. Only five libraries have more than 5 computer with Internet connectivity,
- 9. Seven libraries provide access to internet free of cost.

- 10. Internet is mainly used for sending and receiving e-mail.
- 11. Only three librarians have computer knowledge but six of them are not interested to undergoing any literary training.

6. CONCLUSION

The status of library automation in libraries of intuitions of HKE Society shows that out of eleven libraries of them use computer for library activities, mainly to provide access to Internet and for office correspondence. Internet access is the most used service and all the users all most equally use this facility. And five libraries provide internet access on more than five computers. Internet used mainly for sending and receiving email, a majority of the library staff has not under gone any formal computer training, but they are willing to learn more.

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
