Challenges:

This small case study throws a big challenge for the existence of the library itself especially in the schools of rural area. One has to take up the challenge to motivate the present students to have the reading habits and acquire knowledge. The school management should time to time organize some debates, seminars on the role and importance of the library in the life of the students. From the part of parents/guardians an effort should be made to inculcate motivation from within to have the reading habits. The second challenge is the advent of mobile world. Mobile has taken up the place of library. At present, the students take out the study materials for their exams from the net. So there is no need of going to the library and consult the books.

The third challenge is that the students enroll themselves in schools and colleges just to get the certificates and degrees; and not for the knowledge.

Therefore, it can be said that the students cannot be forced to use the library facilities. However, if they can be made understand the use, importance of library then only something can be done. For this first of all the students have to be inspired from within about the role and importance of the Library facilities.

IMPORTANCE:

In "Reading habit" we get two words "reading" and "habits". Reading is an action of a person who reads and habit is a product of this action or learning. Like all other habits, the habit of reading in "an individual develops during the course of time. Smith and Robinson defined "Reading as an active attempt on the part of reader to understand writer's message". Devarajan defines reading as an "art of interpreting printed and written works". Nowadays, a common allegation is raised that the reading habit is decreasing. It is true that if we go to the reading room of a library, we find most of the seats are dusty. It is really a matter of concern. Reading is a precise process. It involves exact, detailed, sequential perception and identification of letters, words, spelling patterns and large language units. More simply stated, reading is a psycholinguistic guessing game. It involves an interaction between thoughts and language.

Today, the reading has social, academic, economical and survival significance, because democracy of a country can survive when people at large have reading competence. Reading is always a means to an end and not an end in itself. Further, reading is the process of using "eyes" over our "mind" to understand the literal as well as the hidden meaning of what the writer was attempting to convey. Therefore, reading gives both power, and pleasure with understanding.
