ABSTRACT:

Aim of the present study was to find out the role of Parenting Style in Level of Frustration among adolescent. For this propose 80 adolescence were selected by purposively. Parenting style questionnaire, frustration scale was used for data collection and apply descriptive statistic method for data analyses. Results shows that level of regression, fixation and resignation is low among Authoritative parenting Style adolescent then authoritarian parenting Style adolescent but results also found that aggression level is high among Authoritarian parenting Style adolescents.

The family is basically a unit in which parents and children live together. Its key position rest on its multiple functions in relation to overall development of its members, their protection, and overall well-being. Therefore, it would emerge that not only the social and physical well-being of the individual is taken care of by the family, but the psychological well-being as well. Authoritarian parents do not engage in discussions with their teen and family rules and standards are not debated. Authoritarian parents believe the adolescent should accept, without question, the rules and practices that they establish. Research reveals that adolescents of authoritarian parents learn that following parental rules and adherence to strict discipline is valued over independent behavior. As a result, adolescents may become rebellious or dependent.

Frustration results in various types of reactions according to its intensity and nature of the individual experiencing frustration. Some have frustration tolerance to the entent that they bear the consequences with a little injury to the self or society; while others (or the former in the special situations) become too violent and aggressive. Reactions to frustrations are defined by many psychologists in terms of 'defense mechanism, the mechanisms or the means used by the individuals to 'defend the integrity of the ego' as defined in psychological literature.

Adolescence is the period of psychological and social transition between childhood and adulthood. Adolescents struggle with their anxieties, conflicts and confusion. In today world most of adolescent face a problem in making adjustment with others which leads to frustration. Parents make significant role in child development their parenting effect on child emotional word that's why this study will focus on effect of parenting style on frustration among adolescence.

For the present study parenting style questionnaires was administrated on 100 parents to identify the different parenting styles Adopted by them. on the basis of parenting style test score 40 Authoritarian parents and 40 Authoritarian parents Adolescents were selected for the final sample.. All sample selected from Aurangabad city.

Tools and Measure

- 1) Parenting Style Four Factor Questionnaire (PS-FFQ) developed by Shyny T. Y The final scale consists of 32 items. This is five point scale as all of the time, most of the time, some time, rarely and never. The score was five to one. There are no negative items. Scores for each parent were taken separately and sum of scores of each parents were taken for overall score of an item. Thus the instrument yields four separate scores for each participant, namely Authoritarian, Authoritative, Permissive, and Uninvolved.
- 2) Reactions to Frustration Scale: This scale (RFS) was developed by Dr. B.M. Dixit and Dr. D.N. Srivastava (2005). The scale consists 40 items and it has four components, each having 10 items which are equal number of positive and negative items. The components are aggression, resignation, fixation and regression. The validity of the scale is also ascertained by correlating the score of this present scale of frustration with other allied concepts like maladjustment, anxiety and level of aspiration.

Procedure of data collection

On the basis of parenting style test score 40 adolescence were select from each parenting style. After that level of frustration scale was administrated on adolescent by given instruction and data was collected.
