According to Encyclopaedia Britannica, the Qutb Shahi dynasty emerged as one of the successor states of the Bahmani Sultanate. The founder Sultan Quli Qutb-ul-Mulk declared independence in 1518 and established Golconda as the capital. The kingdom later shifted its capital to Hyderabad and became known for diamond trade, strong military aristocracy, and harmonious relations with local Telugu populations. Sailendra Nath Sen in his medieval Indian history studies describes the Qutb Shahi rulers as patrons of culture, trade, and administration. He notes that Golconda became one of the wealthiest kingdoms due to its flourishing trade and political stability. Historical sources such as inscriptions, administrative documents, and contemporary works also contribute to understanding Qutb Shahi administration. For example, inscriptions like Ghazinagar and Pangal inscriptions and works such as *Basantin-us-Salatin* by Mirza Ibrahim Zubairi provide valuable information about administrative structure and governance. According to historical records, the Qutb Shahi rulers promoted Persian and Telugu languages and maintained a multicultural society. The dynasty ruled from Golconda and later Hyderabad, encouraging trade, literature, and architecture. Eventually, the dynasty ended in 1687 when Aurangzeb annexed the kingdom into the Mughal Empire. Thus, the existing literature reveals that the Qutb Shahi dynasty played an important role in shaping the political, cultural, and economic history of the Deccan region. 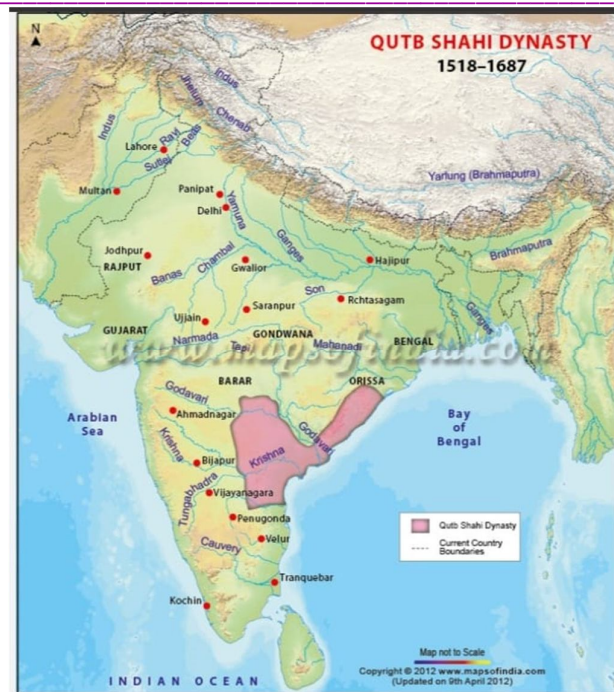
